





*Ghosts of Seattle Past*

Seattle is a city built on booms—logging, fishing, aerospace, and now tech. This anthology gathers essays, interviews, photography, and comix to reconstruct community hubs lost to growth. From the settlements of Native American tribes to the incubators of grunge, from a foxy cabaret to an Old Spaghetti Factory, *Ghosts of Seattle Past* provides an eyes-on-the-street view of a city in flux.

The *Ghosts of Seattle Past* anthology comes at a critical point: Seattle had the country's steepest rent hikes in 2015. The city is becoming a national focal point for issues of development. Both recent transplants and the old guard are trying to figure out how to live in the new landscape. Through their warm, conversational, whip-smart voices, the city's residents speak not only to the current boom, but also to longer-brewing problems of segregation, queer erasure, and colonization. Tracing the issues across six hand-drawn maps, Seattle's best-known artists (including Elissa Washuta, Kate Lebo, and Paul Constant) join community lynchpins (including Chief Seattle's great-great-great-great grandson) in a dialogue as incisively political as it is richly human.

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## Meet the Editor, Cartographer, and Designer





**Jaimee Garbacik** is a book editor, writer, artist, and the owner and founder of Footnote Editorial. She has been privileged to edit for *New York Times*-bestselling authors, Caldecott Honor and Emmy Award recipients, and some of the world's foremost scientists. Jaimee is also the author of *Gender and Sexuality For Beginners* (For Beginners, 2013, illus. by Jeffrey Lewis), a critical examination of the sex-gender system and the evolution of gender roles, currently on curricula at more than a dozen universities. She is a member of the Editorial Freelancers Association and the Northwest Independent Editors Guild, and former programming chair of The Vera Project. When not writing and editing, she spray paints on found windows, guest lectures, and advocates for youth equity. Jaimee feels strongly that ethnographic accounts are crucial for preserving memory, place, and culture. As the daughter of a land surveyor and cartographer, she also adores maps of every kind.


**Josh Powell**, the artist behind the anthology's hand-drawn maps, served as director of the all-ages youth-led music and arts organization The Vera Project for six years; helped to co-found The Bikery, a nonprofit providing all people access to bicycles and bike know-how; and hosted dozens of Secret Cafes to support various organizations. Josh is currently at Seattle's largest environmental remediation firm.



**Jon Horn** is a drawer, screenprinter, bookmaker and wheat-paster who began his journey in visual art as a direct result of moving to Seattle and being immediately welcomed by ZAPP (Zine Archive & Publishing Project) and The Vera Project. Being a part of these spaces allowed him to develop the experimental and cooperative practices in printing and publishing that sustain him still. In the last four years, he has received a GAP grant from Artist Trust, created the science history trading card series, *Supramystic Saga*, launched ZAPP's *Xenographic* periodical, cofounded the print collective, *Fogland Studios*, and was published in *EyesOpen!* magazine. He currently serves on Short Run's advisory board and publishing committee.
